**Ann Echols** is a volunteer community activist. She became our branch treasurer in 2018, and manages funds for our 501(c)3 and 501(c)4 budgets and advises the board on all financial and accounting matters. She helped overhaul our membership process, co-developed our strategic plan, and is a member of our Public Policy Education Subcommittee. In 2019, Ann created and implemented a comprehensive plan for introducing credit cards as a payment method for our Used Book Sale, resulting in an increase of several thousand dollars in sales. In 2020 she joined our Used Book Sale Committee to help identify strategies to minimize losses after the cancellation of the sale due to the pandemic. Ann also serves as Mid-State Literacy Council board chair, works with Leadership (Centre County), and volunteers elsewhere as her time permits. Ann is a talented community connector and a strong team player with a truly diverse set of talents.

### **AAUW MEMBERSHIP DUES CHANGES FOR 2021-2022**

Good news! For the coming membership year (starts July 1) branch dues for AAUW State College members will remain at \$8 and AAUW-PA dues will remain at \$10. After making dramatic cost-cutting measures to meet expenses, national AAUW will limit an increase in dues to \$3 for 2021-2022, from \$59 to \$62. This is the first dues increase in three years. Therefore, **total dues for the coming membership year will increase from \$77 to \$80**. Membership renewals begin later this spring, stay tuned!

### **AAUW FELLOW JENNIFER CARTER PRESENTS: THERMAL RADIATION OF WORLDS BEYOND OUR SOLAR SYSTEM**

**Wednesday, March 10<sup>th</sup>, 7:00 - 8:00 pm**

Jennifer Carter, assistant professor of physics at Susquehanna University, won a research publication grant from AAUW. Her talk will focus on how we can describe the temperature distribution of exoplanets using their emitted light.

Since we can now detect the presence of planets orbiting distant stars, we want to determine as many details of them as possible. Planets orbiting far-away stars mirror the planets of our solar system, but many do not match our previous expectations. For example, the first exoplanets discovered orbit their host stars in less than 3 days whereas the orbit of Mercury is 88 days in length. Since these first discoveries, we have launched several missions to study exoplanets using a variety of techniques.

Carter will focus on one technique that offers the opportunity to detect light emitted directly by the exoplanet, including thermal light. Like a hot iron, closely orbiting exoplanets are hot enough to glow with visible light. As instrumental precision increases, we require more accurate models of this thermal radiation. After reviewing current methods of modeling thermal radiation, Carter will introduce her new model and compare how well each model explains data gathered from exoplanet systems under different conditions.



This following statement is the position of the AAUW State College Branch Co-Presidents.

*When AAUW was founded in 1881, the organization sought to provide an opportunity for women to come together for academic and cultural pursuits. Much has changed since that time. A degree is no longer necessary to make us like-minded. Our mission and our challenges have grown, we need all women to come together as one force if we are to be successful in our mission to advance women and girls in today's society. Moreover, to move our agenda forward, AAUW must have sufficient funding. In the most pragmatic terms, we simply cannot expect foundations and corporations as well as other organizations to support AAUW financially if we don't espouse our own values. It is time to drop the educational degree requirement as a barrier to joining AAUW and our branch. Vote to drop the requirement on the Spring 2021 national ballot.*
