



## REFLECTIONS FROM OUTGOING BRANCH CO-PRESIDENT CINDY HALL

Four-years as Co-President of AAUW State College passed in a blink of an eye (or almost). The turbulence stemming from COVID has been relentless. At the same time, it gave us reason to refocus ourselves and our work, resulting in many moments of pride for our branch.

We were one of a handful of branches to earn all Five Stars from AAUW National in one fell swoop in the early days of COVID. We had accomplished so much as a

branch that our submission was easily achieved despite being, for the most part, locked down.

We developed a three-year strategic plan that was key to our being recognized as a Five-Star Branch by AAUW National. Thanks to Treasurer Ann Echols and her small team.

We redesigned our website and rewrote the far majority of the content to reflect AAUW's and our branch priorities.

We began to accept credit cards at our 2019 Annual Used Book Sale, resulting in increased sales.

We were able to financially skate through without our Annual Used Book Sale in 2020 as well as sell and donate our inventory. At the same time, we had to locate and lease a new Used Book Workshop in a matter of a few months and move the 2021 inventory. The Used Book Sale Committee, led by Dina Liberatore, made all this happen without a playbook.

We moved all of our programming online, partnering with a number of community groups like Community Diversity Group (CDG) to offer Zoom programs. Naana Nti and Nina Cowart and the Program Committee were adept at navigating the technology challenges.

We increased our communications, launching a bi-weekly *Branch Bulletin* with long-time Editor Connie Schroeder at the helm.

Yet, there have been some disappointments—weighing heaviest on my mind is the failure of the AAUW membership to pass the elimination of the postsecondary education requirement in AAUW's Bylaws by the required 65 percent. I, as well as many others, were excited to invite women in our community who had expressed interest in joining us. These women would have proved a valuable asset and it is disheartening that we cannot include them in our ranks.

Our mission is to support and promote women and children. We must evaluate our relationships and interactions with women in our community and each other. Each of us has a role to play in lifting *all* women up. I hope each of us will make a commitment to bring new women into our branch and welcome them as our sisters-in-cause. Together we are a powerful voice for change.

My special thanks to my Co-Presidents during the four years, Sally Kalin and Victoria Sanchez, and congratulations to incoming Co-President Linda Friend.

## FAIR DISTRICTS PA - CENTRE UPDATE

As the Legislative Redistricting Committee begins deliberations on how to draw district lines that will be in effect for the next 10 years, we want to be sure it is done with real election integrity. The passage of SB 222 – Legislative and Congressional Redistricting Act (LACRA) will ensure this.

Our state senator, Jake Corman, has not signed on to this bill as a co-sponsor. The bill is stuck in the State Government Committee and will not be voted out until Senator Corman shows interest in the bill.

Please call Senator Corman at 717-787-1377 and ask him to co-sponsor the bill and encourage the State Government Committee to bring it up for a vote. Assure Senator Corman that this bill does not change who draws the maps, just how it is done. It will enforce stricter transparency and criteria measures for both legislative and congressional maps.

## STUDENTS NEED TO KNOW ABOUT ONLINE SAFETY

Due to the changes to remote instruction during the pandemic, more children have easier access and an increased comfort level accessing the internet from home computers and other devices. Unfortunately, this exposes children to the dark side of remote communications. The Internet can be used by sexual predators and criminals to make initial contact with children and other vulnerable individuals. With this in mind, legislation is being proposed by Pennsylvania Representative Tina Davis of Bucks County to provide education to our children

to prevent them from falling prey to online predators, identify theft, and other dangers. Legislation is being re-introduced that will require schools to give age-appropriate education about online safety for students in grades K-12. This bill would require a unit of instruction, taught at least once each school year. The recommended topics would include:

1. Safe and responsible use of social networking websites, chat rooms, electronic mail, bulletin boards, instant messaging, and other means of communication on the internet
2. Recognizing, avoiding, and reporting online solicitations of students, their classmates, and their friends by sexual predators.
3. Risks of transmitting personal information on the internet.
4. Recognizing and avoiding unsolicited or deceptive communications received online.
5. Recognizing and reporting online harassment and cyber-bullying.
6. Reporting illegal activities and communications on the internet.
7. Copyright laws on written materials, photographs, music, and video.

This bill would also require online availability of relevant resource materials about staying safe online. Let's hope this legislation is successful this time!
