CHARTER SCHOOLS DOUBLE-DIPPING DURING THE PANDEMIC



During the pandemic, Pennsylvania's charter schools received over \$53 million from the Paycheck Protection Program while they continued to receive payments from their school districts. These publicly funded charter schools, paid from taxpayer funds on a per-registered-student basis, did not lose any money during the pandemic and should not have been eligible to receive PPP loans intended to keep small businesses afloat during the shutdown. The charter schools double-dipped when they received PPP revenues, receiving more than their usual funding at taxpayer expense. Rep. Zabel of Delaware County introduced legislation that would require charter schools receiving

PPP loans to reimburse the Commonwealth.
