- Applicant seeks first associate or baccalaureate degree on part-time or full-time basis.

- Applicant completed at least 15 credits of an associate degree or 30 credits for a baccalaureate degree.

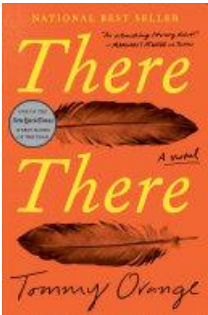


## SCHOOL FUNDING TRIAL UNDERWAY

Last month Education Voters of PA executive director, Sue Spicka (right), joined by nearby AAUW branches, brought a toilet to the capitol steps in Harrisburg to drive home a point about lack of basic facilities. In some schools, 75 students share one toilet! Our state Constitution says, *"The General Assembly shall provide for the maintenance and support of a thorough and efficient system of public education to serve the needs of the Commonwealth."* Unfortunately, this is not the state of affairs in public education, which is the basis for the school funding lawsuit. In mid-November, six school districts and several other entities went to trial against the commonwealth.

As the trial continues, testimony from witnesses representing school districts and retired educators document the severe funding shortfall in many areas of our state. Fortunately, State College does not have such funding issues, but we don't need to travel far to find an underfunded district that lacks essential resources, highlighting the disparities.
