A Conversation with Diverse Women of Influence



League of Women Voters Centre County & local media to provide candidate info for November 7 election

Thanks go to the League of Women Voters Centre County for providing information about candidate interviews for the November 7 election. Local media groups, *C-Net*, the *Centre Daily Times*, and the *Centre County Gazette*,

are working in partnership with LWV to make this possible.

C-Net will do individual candidate interviews and make them available for viewing on the LWVCC website, <u>League of Women Voters Centre County</u>. C-Net will also provide live coverage and will rebroadcast several times prior to the election. **Details:** <u>C-Net</u>

LWVCC hosts Candidates' Night and produces the Voter's Guide. All candidates from areas meeting population standards have been invited to participate in the Voter's Guide; however, only candidates in contested races are invited to participate in Candidates' Night.

Be ready for the November election:

- October 15 Voter's Guide will be in *Centre Daily Times* (both print and digital issues)
- October 17 Send questions for candidates to <u>LWVCC</u> website or email <u>LWVCC email</u>

- October 19 First in a series, voter's Guide will be in the Centre County Gazette.
- October 21 Visit link to Candidate Interviews at LWVCC or C-Net
- October 24 (C-Net) Candidates' Night for all officers EXCEPT school board directors.
- October 26 (C-Net) Candidates' Night for school board directors only.

Questions will also be accepted from live audiences on October 24 and 26.

The League of Women Voters Centre County has also shared their fall deadlines flyer, voter registration form, and mail-in application, all accessible via LWVCC Election Info.

The September issue of the <u>AAUW State College Branch Bulletin</u> included a detailed **Election Guide** (pp. 7-14) and other articles to use while preparing to vote in the fall election. This piece, along with the efforts of the League of Women Voters described above, will adequately prepare readers to make an informed decision. More updates will be shared later this month, as they become available.

Education Committee updates



The Education Committee is following the upcoming school board election. We are concerned about people being elected that have priorities that are not aligned with the mission of AAUW. Be sure to check the above schedule of important dates this month, and encourage friends and family to vote.

We are also following the *Level Up* Funding activity. Presently, a bi-partisan Basic Education Funding Commission is holding

listening sessions around Pennsylvania. Learn more <u>here</u>.

To follow is the key public policy priorities of AAUW-PA which align with those of AAUW.

To support a quality system of public education, AAUW Pennsylvania advocates:

- Opposition to the diversion of public funds to non-public elementary and secondary education, charter, and cyber charter schools
- Support for a fair and adequately funded system of public education
- Strengthening secondary and post-secondary programs that provide women with education, vocational training, and support for success in the workforce, including nontraditional occupations
- Policies promoting inclusion, diversity, equity, and justice in our schools

Fair Districts PA update on the Fix Harrisburg campaign



Fair Districts is continuing with the *Fix Harrisburg* campaign. The main priority is to establish mechanisms to obtain bi-partisan votes. Presently the Pennsylvania legislature is one of the least effective, and most expensive full-time legislatures, in the country. Only about 7% of the bills introduced make it to a final vote.

Go to Fix Harrisburg and sign the petition if you have not done so already.



In 2018, I received my Master of Public Health from the London School of Hygiene and Tropical Medicine. I currently work at Penn State as an Extension educator on adult immunization, cancer prevention, mental health, and vector-borne diseases.

In 2020, we decided to get the dog my third son had been begging for since he was born: Fiona - a beagle - is the fur daughter we never knew we needed! Just like Fiona, I love people, food and lying on the couch with a book!
