

Special Treasures at the Sale






PUBLIC POLICY

Your Primary Election Ballot for May 20



If you requested a <u>mail-in ballot</u>, you should have received it in the mail. If not, call the Centre County Elections Office to inquire about your status: 814-355-6703. If you want a **mail-in ballot but have not yet applied, that deadline is May 13**.

Anyone wishing to **change their party registration must do so by May 5, which is also the deadline to register**. Independents cannot vote in party primaries.

If you are going to <u>vote in person</u>, you can review your sample ballot at https://centrecountypa.gov/238/Elections-Voter-Registration To reach the correct page, look at the black column on your left. Click on the Ballot Information tab. On that page, the bottom item in the black column is Sample Ballots. Clicking there will take you to a page listing every precinct by number and name. Note the full list of Democratic precinct ballots appears before the full list of Republicans because the current Governor is a Democrat. Do be sure to click on your precinct within your party.

We have no competitive races at the county level.

SCHOOL BOARD

School Board races are the most competitive elections races for us in Centre County. For SCASD, both parties have the same seven candidates on their ballots. Vote for four. Democrats, you have five candidates registered in your party: incumbents Deborah Anderson and Jackie Huff and newcomers Jesse Barlow, Jennifer Black, and Rebecca Desmarais. Republicans, you have two registered in your party: Kirsten McTernan and Mihaly Sogor. The county Republican party is encouraging write-ins for their other two spots, but we do not have any names as of this writing.

For School Board races outside the Centre Region, see your party's website, addresses at bottom of this article.

STATEWIDE JUDGES

Democrats: You do not have choices to make in these races. Your candidate for Superior Court, Judge Brandon Neuman, currently is a judge in Washington County. Prior to his election as judge, he was a member of the Pennsylvania House of Representatives. Your candidate for Commonwealth Court, Judge Stella Tsai, currently is a judge in Philadelphia. She is a Penn State graduate. Both are endorsed by the Pennsylvania Democratic Party and are Highly Recommended by the Pennsylvania Bar Association.

Republicans: You have two candidates each for Superior and Commonwealth Court. The state Republican Party endorsed one candidate for each race. The endorsed candidate for Superior Court is Judge Ann Marie Wheatcraft of Chester County. Prior to becoming a judge, she was an Assistant District Attorney. She is Highly Recommended by the Pennsylvania Bar Association. Her opponent, Maria Battista, is Not Recommended because she refused to participate in the

Bar Association's review process. The party endorsed candidate for Commonwealth Court is Matt Wolford, a lawyer in private practice in Erie. Early in his career he was a Deputy Attorney General. As was the case with the two candidates for Superior Court, he is Highly Recommended by the Pennsylvania Bar Association while his opponent, Joshua Prince, is Not Recommended because he refused to participate in the Bar Association's review process.

Ballot drop boxes are out and available to you in the usual locations. Note that you can drop off only your own ballot. Please do follow carefully the instructions with your ballot about using the secrecy envelope and signing and dating the outside of your return envelope.


