2022-2023 AAUW MEMBERSHIP RENEWAL INFORMATION

We've all become increasing comfortable using the web to make purchases, pay bills,

conduct banking transactions, renew memberships, and more. As a result, national AAUW is creating a new member database called the Communication Hub that uses our email address as an identifier rather than our AAUW ID number. The new Communication Hub will enable members to renew AAUW membership at the national, state, and local levels and more. We encourage branch members to create a new account with national AAUW by going on to aauw.org and selecting Logon on the upper right corner of the webpage. OR, members also can go to my.aauw.org to achieve the same outcome.

As State College Branch members anticipate renewing their membership for 2022-2023, please anticipate a \$5 increase in national AAUW dues from \$62 to \$67. State and local dues will remain the same. Therefore, please anticipate paying \$85 for 2022-2023 AAUW membership, which includes national, state, and local membership.

As more details become available about the AAUW renewal process, they will be shared with you this spring. As with any large-scale database change, glitches have reared their ugly heads and are delaying progress. Nevertheless, progress is being made, so stay tuned!

To volunteer for Move-in Night or during the sale as a table volunteer, or cashier, sign up HERE.


To volunteer for the Hospitality Table in the Lobby at the sale, sign up **HERE**.
