JOIN AAUW STATE COLLEGE to ADVOCATE for PUBLIC SCHOOL FUNDING: MAY 24th, HARRISBURG

The in-court testimony for the school funding lawsuit trial concluded on March 10, after four months, with 40 witnesses, and thousands of documents entered into record. Children First and Education Voters PA organized two events in Harrisburg to support adequate school funding to enable quality public education, regardless of local wealth. GET READY to VOTE in the PRIMARY ELECTION on MAY 17th

Deadlines:

The drop boxes are back and ready for your ballot. We realize the news coverage has been confusing about this, but drop boxes remain legal for this election, so you have the choice of putting a

stamp on your mail-in ballot to return it through the post office or dropping it off yourself. (You may not give it to someone else to deposit for you—it's a chain of custody issue.)

If you want a mail-in ballot but have not applied for it, please do so now. The deadline to apply is May 10th, but that is way too close to Election Day, May 17th to be entirely safe. Whether you drop off your mail-in ballot or send it through the U.S. Post Office, the Elections Office must receive it by the time polls close on Election Day, so do not leave this until the last minute.

What's on Your Ballot:

The offices we vote for this year are state and federal: U.S. Senator, Governor, Lt. Governor, and State Representative.

We don't have a Pennsylvania Senate race until 2024, and the Congressional race is unopposed. Local and county elections come around next year.

There are no referenda or ballot questions.

Due to redistricting, you may need to double-check which district you are in now.

<u>Centre County Election Office Voter Districts</u> has a new website. Many other questions can be answered there.

Meet the Candidates:

We have three State Representative districts in the county now -- down from four -- and each party has a candidate. None of them are opposed in the primary, but this is a good time to learn who they are. Here are their <u>C-NET Candidate Interviews</u>.

Because Senator, Governor, and Lt. Governor are all open seats, we have an unusually high number of candidates—especially on the Republican side. The <u>League of Women Voter's</u> <u>Guide</u> provides comprehensive information on the candidates. Check it out.



Good news from AAUW National! Through their *Shape the Future* campaign, the national

organization is offering first-time members the opportunity to join at half-price (\$33.50) provided that they join at this year's Used Book Sale. Be sure to invite friends and colleagues who may be interested. Women who hold an associate or equivalent (RN), baccalaureate, or higher degree from a regionally accredited college or university are eligible to join.

Along with half-price dues from our local branch (\$4) and AAUW Pennsylvania (\$5), the total cost of joining, normally \$85, comes to **\$42.50**, quite a value. Please share this information with potential new members and let them know to apply at the Hospitality table in the front lobby or the Branch Display table in the Cashier area. With the membership year for AAUW running July 1 through June 30, the time to renew your membership is fast approaching. There has been a \$5 increase in national AAUW dues from \$62 to \$67 but State and local dues will remain the same. The total cost of AAUW membership for 2022-2023 is \$85, which includes national, state,


MEMBERSHIP RENEWAL INSTRUCTIONS:

- 1. Go to the AAUW website: www.aauw.org
- 2. Click LOG IN in the upper right corner.
- 3. Follow the steps to <u>change your password</u>. Your email address will now serve as your ID (formerly it was your AAUW membership number, which no one could remember). Make sure to document the new password you select.
- 4. Once you have your new password, go to: https://my.aauw.org and log in. After you confirm your address, etc., in the profile, click on the RENEW button.

NOTE: SKIP THE OPTION OF DOCUMENTING YOUR DEGREES. THERE APPEAR TO BE BUGS IN THE SOFTWARE AS IT IS NOT WORKING CORRECTLY.

- 5. Follow the steps to renew your national (all but \$3 is tax-deductible), local, and state AAUW memberships.
- 6. Print or download your receipt.


