
Four Penn State University Park women attend AAUW-led NCCWSL

Branch awards \$5,000 to AAUW Pennsylvania



At their July 2023 meeting the AAUW State College Executive Committee elected to award \$5,000 to [AAUW Pennsylvania](#) for the 2023-2024 FY. AAUW PA provides important support and resources to AAUW branches around the state, including information-sharing and networking through retreats and meetings, relevant webinars pertaining to public policy issues, and funds NCCWSL scholarships.

While the vast majority of dollars that AAUW State College awards stay in Centre County, our combined contributions to AAUW PA and AAUW National for the current year total \$20,000. 

Let's Read Math provides summer STEM opportunity for children





Education Committee Updates



We just returned from an excellent AAUW PA summer retreat, *Women Together – Fighting on the Front Line*. The following is our front line in education for this fall. One AAUW-Pennsylvania public policy priority is to support a quality system of public education. There are three important issues to watch:

Cyber Charter School Reform: House Bill 1422 is a bill that addresses many reforms including funding and oversight. It has passed the Pennsylvania House of Representatives with bipartisan support. When the Pennsylvania Senate returns in the fall they will make a decision on this bill. **Details:** https://edvoterspa.org/charter_schools/. State Budget: This has not passed due to a dispute over school vouchers. Governor Shapiro has promised to sign the bill with a line-item veto of the PASS scholarship program (a voucher program). The Senate dismissed for vacation without passing the bill. As soon as the Senate comes back into session Governor Shapiro can sign the bill, and no vote is necessary as long as the Senate is in session. Per Education Voters of PA, there were hundreds of calls and thousands of emails sent against school vouchers. Thanks those of you who participated.

School Board Elections in November: We must pay attention to those running for the SCSAD school board and their views. School boards are being targeted by people with views that are detrimental to public education, such as book banning and curriculum involvement. It is extremely important to vote and urge everyone you know to vote. More on this next month.

I am excited to work with the AAUW community to support the education and empowerment of women and girls, and look forward to learning more about opportunities to get involved.






